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## **Question 1**

### **Reference to 5.16.1:**

**Question regarding Answer 25 (27th January 2017) and Answer 3 (4th Feb 2017).**

### **Answer 1**

According to Answer 25 of the Q&A document (27/01/2017) each subcontractor should submit all mandatory documentation required in section 5.16.1 of the ToR Public version. Further clarifications and details related to the documentation that subcontractors should submit can be found also in Answer 12 (27th January 2017).

## **Question 2**

**Question regarding Answer 3 (4 Feb 2017).**

### **Answer 2**

Each Economic Operator, shall provide in the STEP 1 only one Guarantee Participation valid for both solutions (where applicable). Moreover, as it clearly stated in the ToR Public Version each economic operator may submit a tender for one of the solutions or separate tenders for both solutions (Solution 1 and Solution 2). However, in the latter case the tenderer can be awarded only one (1) contract (for either Solution 1 or Solution 2).

## **Question 3**

**Further clarifications related to the 5.16 certificates.**

### **Answer 3**

According to section 5.16.1i of the ToR public version, a self-declaration is required in which all economic operators will declare that a) they don't fall into the exclusion grounds cases, b) they fulfill all the selection criteria of the tender document, c) their



request for participation is valid for at least ... (to be completed) months, starting from the date of its submission.

The required self-declaration is a declaration of honor. Greek economic operators should use the declaration of article 8 paragraph 4 of the Law 1599/1986 (OJ A 75), which contains penalties in case of a statement of false information. Non-Greek economic operators may use any equivalent document.

No certification of authenticity is required.
